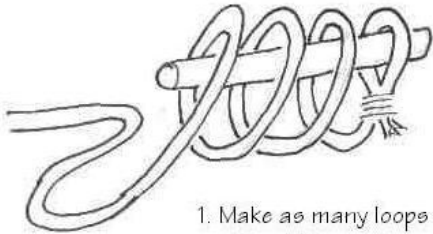
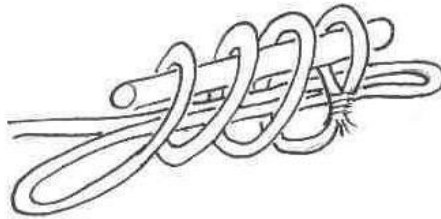


Slatts knot

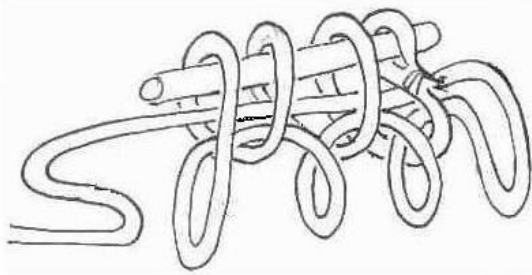
The SLATTS Knot



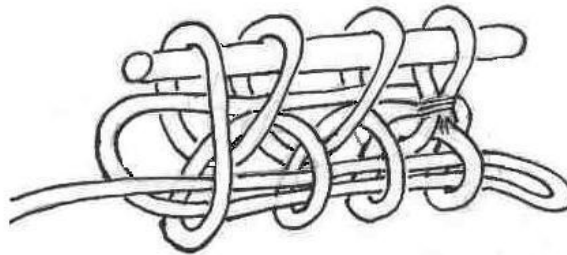
1. Make as many loops as the width requires



2. Pull loose end loop through

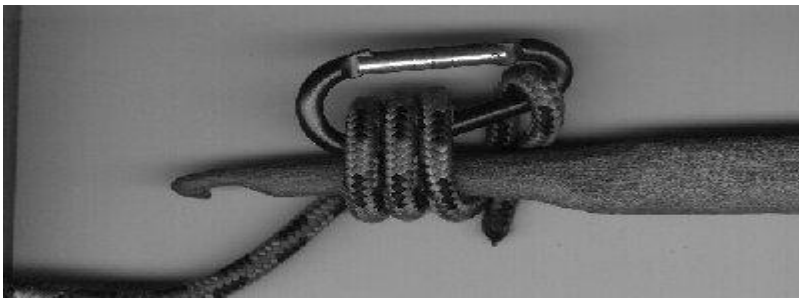


3. Pull new row of loops through from attached end . Not loose end.



4. Pull loose end loop through again and repete from 3. untill you have the length you want

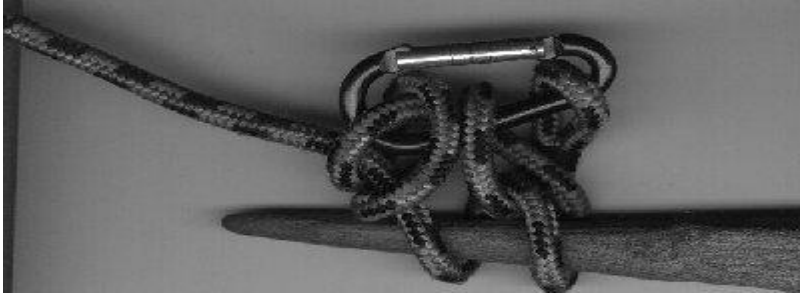

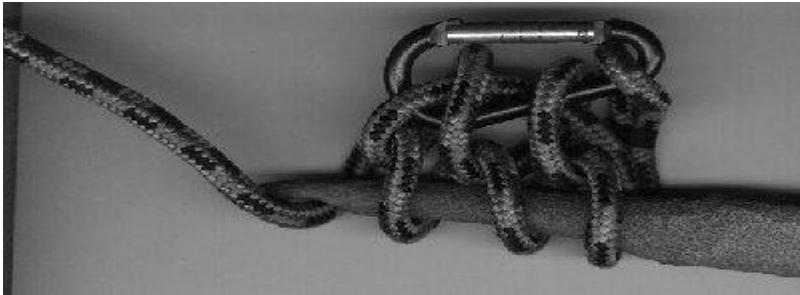
Make the required number of loops.



Pull the last loop through but don't pull any of the others through, just the last one. Keep a bit of slack, if you tie it too tight it will not run free when you need it in a hurry.



Using the tool grab the next loop.



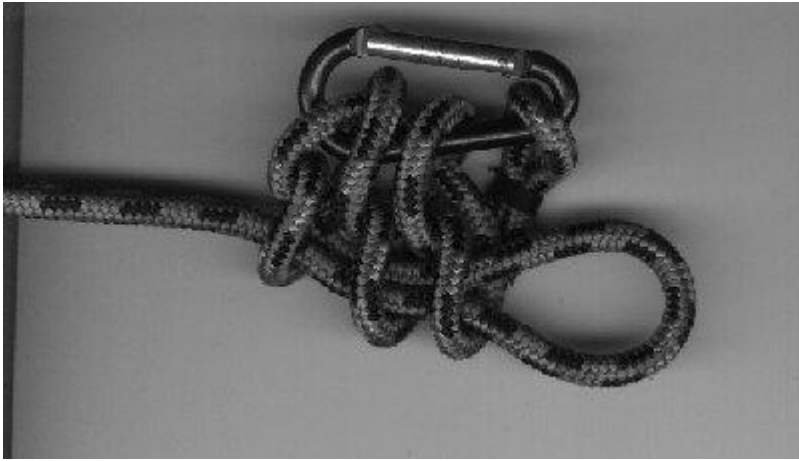
Then the next in turn to the end.



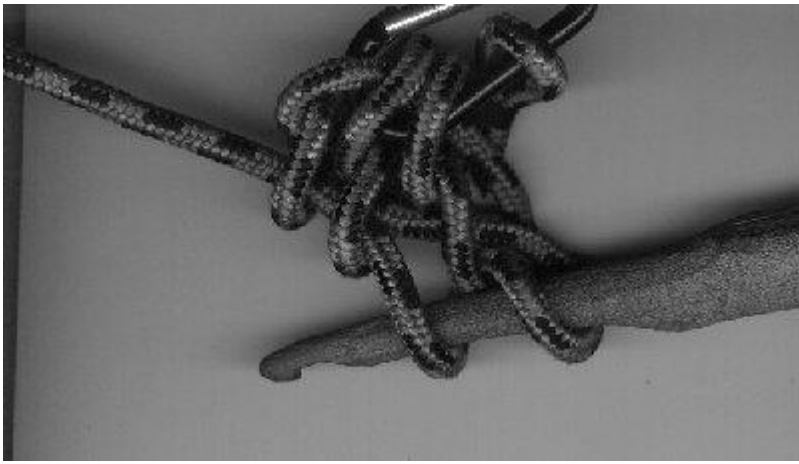
Now start again to pull the last loop back through. You will note that from now on you can't accidentally pull other loops . That will only happen with the first set.



Till it's all the way through.



Like this.



Now start grabbing loops again.

Then carry on till you have the length you want. don't tie it too tight, as it will not run free when you need to pull it out in a hurry.
